Since graduating from high school in 1985, Jerome Mayne – a regular guy – had a kid, got married, had another kid, built a real estate investment company, got divorced, built a finance company, went to prison, got cancer, lived, got out of prison, had miracle child, and then he got married again.

Needless to say, he has a few stories to tell.

In his mid-20's Jerome was an aspiring finance professional. His first job in the corporate world was with a national mortgage banking corporation. He grew as an entrepreneur, climbing the corporate ladder until he finally reached the top position of president and CEO of the companies that he founded.

His stay on the top ended in a hurricane of FBI investigations, indictments, criminal court appearances and finally prison. He was charged with mail fraud, wire fraud and money laundering stemming from his decisions years earlier while working at his first job in finance. He ultimately received a 21-month prison sentence, and his life was changed forever.

For the past 15 years Jerome has been speaking on choices and consequences, fraud and ethics for associations and Fortune 500 companies in Canada, Mexico and the United States.

He has appeared on numerous panels, radio shows and web-cast productions as a self-taught expert on fraudulent behavior. He has been a contributing columnist for the California CPA Magazine and the Business Journal. He is the author of the book *Diary of a White-Collar Criminal*, and real estate continuing education course *Mortgage Fraud and Predatory Lending – what every agent should know* (Dearborn/Kaplan).
